




Country Overview




- Located in the south of the kingdom of Jordan in the village of Wadi Musa
- Opening hours: 6 am 7 pm (summer) / 6am 5 pm (winter)
- it covers more than 60 square kilometers
- since 2007 it is one of the new seven wonders of the world
- the ancient city of Petra was built by the nomadic tribe of the Nabataeans in the 3rd Century BC.
- the most famous building is called "The Treasury" which can be reached through the famous Siq a deep canyon which leads to the famous city
- more than 1 million tourists from all over the world visit Petra every year
- experts estimate that only 20 percent of the ancient city has already been excavated
- the Hollywood blockbuster Indiana Jones were filmed in Petra

How to get around?



Only Walking: Petra is a massive site and it takes a while to get around but the best option is by foot, so where proper shoes

Recommended Hikes:

- High Places of Sacrifice Trail (3km 3,5 4 h)
- Al-Khubtha Trail (3,5 km 2,5 3 h)
- Ad Deir Trail (2,5 km 2,5 3 h)





Good to know!

- If you plan to travel around Jordan, we recommend you to buy the Jordan Pass (entrance for Petra is included in the pass)
- try to visit Petra right after the site opens. The light in the morning is much better and there are less people around
- if you travel in high season book your accommodation in advance!
- be prepared for your visit (proper cloth, sunscreen, hat, snacks, water) you will probably spend around 8 to 9 hours in Petra (Keep in mind: it can get pretty hot and there is almost no shade in the whole site!)
- please avoid riding camels, horse carriages or donkeys. The animals are not treated very well please do not support this!!!
- do not buy anything from kids inside Petra there are a lot of them selling postcards and souvenirs - those kids should go to school and should not hang around in Petra
- There is a second, non-legal viewpoint from where you can see the treasure from above. Locals try to take tourist up there for little money. The path is much shorter, but not legal and it can be very dangerous for inexperienced people.
